Built soon after the Battle of Hastings	William brought one readymade	Built on human-made hills	Involved hundreds of workers	Needed a licence to build	Built in days	Easy to burn	Very expensive
Often rotted	Featured crenellations	Included high lookout tower	Only temporary	Made with wood	Often with barbican	'Killing Fields'	Often very large
Some took years to build	Stonemasons needed	Hill occasionally collapsed	None left standing today	Included murder holes	Surrounded with wooden fence	Bow loops in wall	Often dozens of separate buildings
Replaced by stone castles	Pictured in Bayeux tapestry	Smallest castles	Entrance often high in wall	For example, the Tower of London	Several floors high	Too heavy to build on a motte	Very thick walls
Windows were open spaces	Also baron's home	Many exist today	At risk from siege	Fire hazard	Rotted away over time	Cramped buildings	Built-in toilets
Built for defence	Included machicolations	Surrounded with barrier	Large private rooms	Open windows	Wooden palisades	Gradually replaced by stone	Often on very steep slope
